His Majesty attends 2014 ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit

SEOUL, REPUBLIC OF KOREA, December 9 - His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam left for the Republic of Korea to attend the 2014 ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit, which was held in conjunction with the 25th anniversary of ASEAN-Republic of Korea relations.

During the three-day state visit, His Majesty held a bilateral meeting with the President of the Republic of Korea, Her Excellency Park Geun-hye and witnessed the signing of an Agreement and Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and the Government of the Republic of Korea at the Cheong Wa Dae (Blue House) in Seoul.

During the meeting, both leaders exchanged views on bilateral relations and efforts to enhance cooperation between Brunei Darussalam and the Republic of Korea as well as matters relating to regional and international affairs of mutual concern.

Afterward, both leaders witnessed the signing of Agreement of the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income. The Minister of Finance II at the Prime Minister's Office, The Honourable Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Setia Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Abdul Rahman bin Haji Ibrahim signed on behalf of the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam while the Republic of Korea was represented by His Excellency Yun Byung-se, the Minister of Foreign Affairs.

It was followed by the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding on Education. The Minister of Finance II at the Prime Minister's Office represented the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam while the Republic of Korea was represented by His Excellency Hwang Woo-yea, the Minister of Education.

Then, the Minister of Finance II at the Prime Minister's Office signed the Memorandum of Understanding on Agriculture on behalf of the Government of His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam while the Republic of Korea was represented by His Excellency Lee Dong-phil, the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs.

At a State Banquet hosted by the President of the Republic of Korea at the Yeong Bin Gwan Hall, Cheong Wa Dae, His Majesty in a *titah*

(royal speech) lauded the strong partnership between both countries spanning over the past 20 years, as energy cooperation remains the core of economic engagement between both countries.

His Majesty also expressed pleasure that the Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) contract with the Republic of Korea has been extended until 2018.

Brunei Darussalam values the Republic of Korea's assistance in constructing vessels for the sultanate's LNG consignments and is ready to continue working closely with the republic to further enhance the cooperation in this field, His Majesty said.

In addition, His Majesty is pleased to see that the existing relationship between both countries is further strengthened by signing the three new agreements. His Majesty also acknowledged that both countries have enjoyed progress in bilateral cooperation that extends to many areas including energy, education, agriculture and communication.

His Majesty further stated that the sultanate hopes to learn from the republic's experience in order to realise

Malay is the official language but English is widely spoken.




Islam is the official religion and it allows other religions to be practiced.



ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit 2014 in Busan, Republic of Korea

BUSAN, REPUBLIC OF KOREA, December 12 – His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam attended the First and Second Sessions of the 2014 ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit held at the Busan Exhibition and Convention Centre (BEXCO).

At the first session of the ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit, His Majesty highlighted in a *titah* (royal speech) the importance of continuing the efforts and work under the ASEAN-Republic of Korea ICT Partnership Project to develop innovative and practical ways to use ICT to enhance the lives of the people.

Cooperation is vital, as the Republic of Korea has been established itself as a leader in the field of ICT, His Majesty said.

In the last four years, the Republic of Korea has been rated as the top country in the ICT Development Index. This is indeed a remarkable achievement, which indicates the deep integration of ICT in the Republic of Korea's society, and demonstrates how readily accessible the Internet is to the public, particularly through extensive usage of mobile communication, His Majesty added.

ICT is fast becoming the foundation

for many commercial activities, and developing further knowledge and expertise in this field has the potential to bring much economic benefit to the future of the region.

His Majesty further stated that at the heart of its cooperation is the relationship shared by the people of ASEAN and the Republic of Korea including the youths.

The trust and confidence among the youths are the foundation for a sustainable future. Therefore, ASEAN and the Republic of Korea should continue its commitment to nurture these relationships through the various exchange programmes.

His Majesty hopes to see the continuation of activities such as the ASEAN-Republic of Korea Youth Exchange Programmes, which would help the region to promote greater understanding and mutual respect.

In addition, His Majesty expressed delight that this year marked the 25th anniversary of the ASEAN-Republic of Korea partnership and the 30th year of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Brunei Darussalam and the Republic of Korea.

His Majesty also expressed pleasure that the longstanding bilateral ties have now expanded to cover many areas including energy, trade, ICT as well as people-to-people exchanges. The cooperation is further supported at the

regional level through the ASEAN-Republic of Korea and ASEAN Plus Three frameworks.

Concluding the *titah*, His Majesty stated that it is apparent that ASEAN-Republic of Korea relations would deepen and be further strengthened, bringing much benefit to the people and the region.

His Majesty then expressed appreciation to the President of the Republic of Korea for bringing together ASEAN at the meeting as well as to the President of the Republic of Indonesia for the country's excellent effort in facilitating the relationship between ASEAN and the Republic of Indonesia.

His Majesty also extended appreciation for the continued support from all of ASEAN's dialogue partners, including the Republic of Korea, which has helped realise its Community goals.

At the second session of the ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit, His Majesty emphasised on climate change.

Climate change and its negative effects on people and their livelihood is a concern recognised by ASEAN, His Majesty said.

Last month, ASEAN reaffirmed its commitment to address climate change and hoped for the support of all its partners in tackling climate change.

There was also a global recognition

for the need to address climate change as discussed at the United Nations Climate Summit this year, said His Majesty.

In the *titah*, His Majesty expressed appreciation to the President of the Republic of Korea for her donation of an additional US\$100 million to the Green Climate Change Fund and said that ASEAN values the Republic of Korea's efforts to mitigate the effects of climate change through initiatives such as forest conservation.

His Majesty said that Brunei Darussalam is working closely with the Republic of Indonesia and Malaysia

to address climate change. Brunei Darussalam has allocated 58 per cent of its land area, which is part of the Heart of Borneo, for forest conservation. His Majesty also welcomes all potential partners who are interested in the work to preserve biodiversity of the region's rainforests.

In addition, His Majesty noted that East Asia is a one of the most prominent areas that is most affected by natural disasters. The region experiences flooding, typhoons and landslides as well as strong earthquakes, volcanic activity and tsunamis. However, its geographical proximity enables it to react quickly in providing humanitarian assistance and disaster relief in the region.

In this regard, His Majesty hoped that the region would be able to deepen its cooperation and create measures that would help each other in the future.

His Majesty, in the *titah*, conveyed condolences to the Republic of Korea, the Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of the Philippines on the sinking of a Korean fishing vessel in Russian waters, and to the people of the Republic of the Philippines on the devastation brought by Typhoon Hagupit.

His Majesty also expressed appreciation to the President of the Republic of Korea, the Government and the people of the Republic of Korea for the warm welcome and hospitality accorded to His Majesty and the delegation since arriving in Busan.

Earlier, His Majesty was greeted upon arrival at the Lobby of the Convention Center by the Secretary General of the Preparatory Office for the ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit 2014, His Excellency Choi Jong-moon.

His Majesty then proceeded to the upper level of the Convention Centre where His Majesty was greeted by the President of the Republic of Korea.

Afterward, His Majesty joined other Heads of State and Government attending the ASEAN-Republic of Korea Commemorative Summit for a group photo session.

Upon arrival at the Gimhae Air Base in Busan on November 11, His Majesty was greeted by the Mayor of Busan Suh Byun-soo; the Deputy Minister for Economic

government officials as well as students who excel in their studies and are active in extra-curricular activities for afternoon tea at the Wellington Ballroom. Their Majesties then signed a commemorative parchment.

Afterward, the Get-Together ceremony proceeded with a welcoming remark by Radin Abdullah bin Radin Mas Basiuni, the President of the Brunei Students' Union in the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland. After delivering the *titah*, His Majesty conferred the 'The Chancellor's Scholar' upon the scholars.

Brunei Solutions Development Centre launched

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, December 1 – The facility for the Brunei Solutions Development Centre (BSDC), funded by the e-Government National Centre (eGNC) and managed by Microsoft, was officially launched at the Knowledge Hub in Berakas.

The Minister of Energy at the Prime Minister's Office, The Honourable Pehin Datu Singamanteri Colonel (Rtd.) Dato Seri Setia (Dr.) Awang Haji Mohammad Yasmin bin Haji Umar was present at the opening ceremony as the guest of honour.

BSDC's objectives are to provide a facility to develop 'Made-in-Brunei' software solutions and to assist with the skills development of the local information technology (IT) ecosystem.

Moreover, it aims to accelerate the growth and increase the quality of local information and communications technology (ICT) industry by providing collaborative training and knowledge transfer programmes to local IT graduates and service providers.

Speaking at the launch of the centre, Fredrik Nylander, the Head of Enterprise

Services of Microsoft Southeast Asia said that Microsoft is committed to help Brunei Darussalam produce its own software applications for the government as well as for the private sector.

One of the key features of BSDC is providing regular training and certification in both technical and non-technical aspects of solution development to the Capability and Mentorship Programme (CAMP) interns, IT partners and other interested parties.

The BSDC's CAMP programme first started in November 2013 to nurture the local ICT professionals' skill development, and currently has trained ten local interns. Four local IT companies have also been accredited into the IT Vendor Programme.

The BSDC contract was signed between EGNC and Microsoft on March 28, 2013 and its first development project started on October 28, 2013. The centre is currently implementing two projects for two government departments.

At the event, the minister presented the 'Microsoft Certified Solutions Developer, specializing in Sharepoint Applications' certificates to two of the very first local Bruneians who were awarded with the accreditation. They were Haji Mohammad Hazmi bin Pengiran Haji Othman and Nuruljannah Binti Noor Hadee.

The ceremony also saw a video presentation and an exhibition on BSDC.

Yusof and Malaysia's Minister of Health, The Honourable Datuk Seri Dr. S. Subramaniam at the end of the meeting held at the Indera Kayangan Ballroom, The Empire Hotel and Country Club.

The Brunei Darussalam minister said they are satisfied with the outcome of the meeting and praised the efforts of the senior officials and the technical working group in implementing the joint work plans.

He also highlighted the importance of continuing cooperation in sharing information, capacity building and research and joint operations. This includes monitoring and controlling of

communicable diseases; food quality and safety control; drugs and cosmetics control; preventing and controlling of non-communicable diseases; developing manpower; transferring patients across borders; traditional and complimentary medicine; health tourism and utilising information and communication technology.

The success of the joint work plan

on cross border transfer of patients, they explained, have resulted in the establishment of harmonised procedures and guidelines as well as good networking among the health, immigration and customs of both countries that will assure continued effective facilitation of patients' transfer.

Other than that, the ministers strengthened their commitment in combating non-communicable diseases (NCDs) and addressing the risk factors of NCDs that include joint activities that promote community-based health promotion programmes, people-centred care and cost-effective intervention and management of diseases.

In relation to this, the minister urged senior officials and the technical working group to monitor the progress of the

activities as well as review the health cooperation under the joint work plans from time to time and encourage both sides to be proactive and to use new approaches or initiatives in handling health challenges of both countries.

"We also reaffirmed our commitment in further strengthening health cooperation between the two countries as agreed in the Memorandum of Understanding concerning the health and welfare of the people of both countries," said the minister.

Meanwhile Malaysia's Minister of Health said that Malaysia greatly welcomes the cooperation in all fields that benefit the two countries through experience and expertise.

At the press conference, he also highlighted the three prioritised fields: strengthening the development of the health sector through sharing of experience and expertise; enhancing the cooperation in the level of ASEAN particularly when ASEAN becomes a community by 2015;

and the international health issues and how the two countries can enhance as well as strengthen cooperation in facing challenges.

"It will be important with the development of ASEAN Economic Community post 2015 and how the agenda of ASEAN could be structured so that common health issues which affect Asean as a whole could be handled through our collaborative mechanism," he explained.

He added that they will strengthen the collaboration in the three fields at the national, regional and international level to ensure the two countries will benefit from their experience and expertise.

The 8th Bilateral Ministers of Health Meeting and the 8th Bilateral Ministry of Health Senior Officials Meeting will be hosted by Malaysia in 2016.

JAKARTA, REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA, December 5 – Brunei Darussalam is committed to work with ASEAN Member States to combat drug crimes.

The Minister of Energy at Prime Minister's Office, The Honourable Pehin Datu Singamenteri Kolonel (Rtd.) Dato Seri Setia (Dr.) Awang Haji Mohammad Yasmin bin Haji Umar emphasised this at the 3rd ASEAN Ministerial Meeting (AMMDM) in Jakarta held from December 1 to 4.

At the meeting, he highlighted the success of the implementation of the community-based treatment programme, which incorporates therapeutic community approach and encourages voluntary admission, at the Pusat Al-Islah Rehabilitation Centre in Brunei Darussalam.

Brunei Darussalam will continue to strive in combating illicit drug issue that not only threatens security and order but also the economy and social state of the country, which is aligned with His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam's vision, he said.

Additionally, the minister called for ASEAN to review its strategies of past last decade and said that the strategy should acknowledge the challenges and gaps in fighting drug crimes.

He also called for a more holistic and balanced drug policy to promote security and development for the post-2015 ASEAN drug strategy.

Meanwhile, the chairman of the 3rd AMMDM, Police Commissioner General of the Republic of Indonesia, Anang Iskandar expressed concerns regarding the increasing threat of trafficking and abuse of illicit drugs in the region, and reaffirmed their strong commitment in enhancing regional cooperation and continuing relentless work in reducing illegal drug use.

According to the chairman, the ministers agreed that the regional aspiration of 'Drug-Free ASEAN', which signifies ASEAN resilience and commitment towards a zero tolerance approach in protecting the community from illicit drugs, should be maintained.

The ministers also exchanged views

in regards to existing and new challenges such as 'New Psychoactive Substance' that has risen, and reaffirmed their commitment in strengthening regional cooperation and continuing to work hard to combat drug crime.

The chairman also stressed that the relentless actions against drug threat and abuse must be an ongoing and lifelong effort that requires hard work, more coordination and effective actions beyond 2015.

Thus, there is a need for a new paradigm of managing risks of drugs to be implemented, with a new strategy and approach that balances both the treatment and prevention approach with the law enforcement approach, he said.

Additionally, a comprehensive concept paper on the institutionalisation of the ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Drug Matters was also approved and welcomed, while work on the regional review titled 'Achieving a Drug Free 2015: Review and Recommendations Post 2015' is still ongoing.

has introduced various regulations and programmes to promote work-life balance, such as an increase from 56 days to 105 days of maternity leave, holiday allowance for government employees every four years, the choice of early retirement, the establishment of childcare centres at the workplace as well as work-life balance workshops for all employees.

He explained that the national plan of action towards promoting, protecting and strengthening the family institution has already been set up by a Women and Family Institution special committee under a National Council Against Social Issues.

The plan of action focuses on eight strategic issues including strengthening of the family institution, balancing work and family life, economy, education, health and women's right and legislations, he said.

This year, the 6th EAMFF was officiated

by the Minister of Gender Equality and Family of the Republic of Korea, Her Excellency Kim Heejung.

It saw the participation of ministers from Brunei Darussalam, the Kingdom of Cambodia, the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Indonesia, Japan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malaysia, the Republic of the Philippines, Kingdom of Thailand, the Democratic Republic of Timor Leste, Socialist Republic of Viet Nam and the host country, the Republic of Korea.

The ministers agreed to develop an international family-friendly social environment index that can be applied to the member countries and combine the EAMFF and the East Asia Gender Equality Ministerial Meeting in 2016 to focus on the agenda that can effectively contribute to the realization of family friendly and gender equal society.

The forum also adopted the Seoul Declaration that outlined 12 operative action lines to strengthen and support efforts towards creating a family-friendly

social environment

Earlier, the forum was preceded by a senior officials meeting attended by the Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports, Yang Mulia Dato Paduka Haji Mohd Hamid bin Haji Mohd Jaafar.

The Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Brunei Darussalam to the Republic of Korea, His Excellency Dato Paduka Awang Haji Harun bin Haji Ismail and senior officers at the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports were also present to attend the forum.

The next ministerial meeting will be held at the Kingdom of Thailand in 2016.



iFlyBrunei application launched

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, December 20 – A mobile application called 'iFlyBrunei' was launched to provide the public, especially passengers, with easy access to the latest information on flights, rules and regulations as well as the services and facilities offered at the Brunei International Airport.

The Minister of Communications, The Honourable Pehin Orang Kaya Hamzah Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Abdullah bin Begawan Mudim Dato Paduka Haji Bakar launched the application at the International Civil Aviation Day celebration held at the Royal Brunei Recreational Club in Berakas.

The 'iFlyBrunei' is one of the initiatives taken by the Civil Aviation Department in support of the ministry's vision to create a 'smart society' by 2017.

Speaking at the International Civil Aviation Day, the minister said that the civil aviation industry has made tremendous achievements throughout the 60 years of its establishment.

He further said the Brunei International Airport's runway length has quadrupled from its initial 3,000 feet to 12,000 feet long. The previous runway could only accommodate light aircraft, now it can accommodate the B747 plane.

The standard of the airfield lighting system has been upgraded and an Instrument Landing System has also been installed, he added.

The large-scale passenger terminals can now accommodate more than 3 million passengers per year. Previously, passengers were required to use the stairs to leave the aircraft but now, they can walk

onto the aerobridge that connects the aircraft to the terminal building.

The developments in civil aviation also included the localisation of its employees, he continued.

As the country is increasing its flights regionally and internationally, the minister called for an upgrade to improve the airport and aircraft safety.

Minister launches 2nd Brunei Darussalam National Games

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, November 29 – The Minister of Culture, Youth and Sports, The Honourable Pehin Orang Kaya Pekerma Laila Diraja Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Hazair bin Haji Abdullah officiated the opening ceremony of the 2nd Brunei Darussalam National Games (SKBD) at the Indoor Stadium of the Hassanal Bolkiah National Sports Complex in Berakas.

The minister, in his speech, said that the SKBD encourages and supports the community in Brunei Darussalam to be more active in sports. It also hopes to increase efforts and understanding among the public and private sectors as well as the national sports organisation by holding the tournament together.

Sports, he said, have contributed to the glory and success of the country and it is their goal to enhance the performance of athletes and national contingents in high performance sports at regional and international level.

The minister encouraged the efforts to further organise SKBD not only in Brunei-Muara District but also in Belait District, Tutong District and Temburong District.

He explained that the SKBD acts as a platform that would identify potential athletes who can compete at the international level and provide them with athletic programmes as well as continuous support and assistance.

“SKBD could facilitate the development of talents and abilities of local athletes before they participate in more prestigious international tournaments. Athletes and sports organisations must focus on their own goals and achievements instead of solely focusing on winning awards and medals,” he continued.

In relation to that, the minister advised stakeholders in each district to provide the athletes’ achievement records and pointed out that all contingents should take strategic steps in progressing to higher levels, with more systematic and organised planning, executing and reviewing of training.

Additionally, he announced that random sample test would be carried out for the first time to ensure that there would be no misuse of drugs among the athletes during the tournament. This is aligned with the objective of the Ministry of Culture,

Youth and Sports to prevent athletes from misusing prohibited drugs as stated by the World Anti-Doping Code, he said.

Other than that, the minister said that it is the responsibility of all parties to attain national achievement in high performance sports at regional and international level.

He also called upon the public and media to provide moral support and positive encouragement to the athletes and sports unions.

“Supporters need to have the mindset ‘swim together, sink together’ with the athletes and national contingents,” he said.

A total of 2,754 athletes will compete in athletics, badminton, basketball, cue sports, cycling (road and mountain biking), darts, fencing, football, futsal, gasing (top spinning), golf, hockey, karatedo, netball, pencak silat, petanque, regatta, sepak takraw, softball, taekwondo, tenpin bowling, tug of war and wushu.


